Story focus: The Colour Monster

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Watch the story "While we can't hug". <u>CLICK HERE FOR LINK</u>
- How can you/have you shown people outside of your home that you love them.
 Discuss how your child is feeling currently and their experiences since school closed
- and how they are feeling about being back at school.
- Talk about the colour monster and his feelings associated with different colours. What colour would you give the feelings of sad, happy, love, angry, fear and calm.
- Make a feelings jar fill it with all the things that make you feel the above emotions. You can use objects, labels, pictures, etc. Discuss how all these feelings and emotions are inside of us and that is OK. Emphasise happiness and what makes us happy again.

Communication and Language

- Watch the clip from the film "Inside Out". <u>CLICK HERE FOR LINK</u>
- Talk about how she is feeling each time and why. Have you ever felt that feeling, why? What did you do/how did you react?
- Model with an example..." I feel happiness when you give me a hug or when the sun is shining" for your child to respond and discuss their feelings and experiences since the closure of school and about the return to school next week.

- Draw a picture of your favourite part of the Rainbow investigation and finish the sentence..." I liked it when..."
- Talk about the process and draw/write instructions for how to make a rainbow ice lolly/fruit salad using the words First, Next, Then, Last.

Mathematics

- Count from 0-10 and back again until secure Write numbers on separate pieces of paper – remove one – can your child spot which is missing by using counting?
- Write the numerals 1-10 using rainbow writing write each number in different colours – can you find the correct number of objects of the same colour as the number to go with each one?
- Make patterns using different coloured objects Can your child work out what comes next? Have your child make a pattern for you to finish.

- Go on a Rainbow Colour Hunt outside. Draw a colour chart and write a list of what you have collected/seen.
