Dear Parents and Carers,

Let me start this letter by saying 'YOU ARE AMAZING' Parents and carers, you have done an amazing job of home schooling and looking after your children throughout this latest lockdown. I am so proud of our children for their hard work and attitude throughout but I am also incredibly proud of you!

I have collated the information that you have shared about returning to school and I thank you for you honest feedback. Let's get our children back to school where they can learn and plan together, we've got this!

I am very pleased to say that Skerton St Luke's CE Primary School will open as normal from Monday 8th March to all pupils. This could change if we do not have enough staff available to open fully or if the government directs us to only open for Key Worker and Vulnerable children again.

We will continue to keep all protective measures in place and I will upload the revised risk assessment to the school website tonight. Within school we will continue to adhere to the 3 main actions we are all asked to take:

Wash hands - We will be continuing to wash hands frequently throughout the school day. We will continue with our enhanced cleaning regime.

Cover face - Staff will be wearing face coverings in communal areas and at beginning and end of each school day. Staff will continue to be offered visors that can be worn throughout the day to provide some protection when interacting with children. Staff with underlying health issues have also been reassured that it is absolutely acceptable to wear a face covering in the classroom and when working one to one or with small groups of children.

Make space - In the classroom this is the most difficult aspect to maintain. Each classroom has been reviewed and we have used as much additional space as we can. The children will also continue to move around school and have break times within their class bubbles.

How can parents and carers help?

The risk from Covid-19 and its variants has not gone away. Please help us by doing the following:

• **Wear face coverings** when coming onto the school grounds. If you are exempt you **must** remain at least 2m from any other person outside your household or bubble.

- Do not speak directly to school staff to pass on information and messages all contact **must** be via phone call to school, email contact-us@skertonstlukes.lancs.sch.uk or Class Dojo.
- Only **1 adult** to collect or drop off at the beginning and end of each school day. Additional adults must wait outside the school gates.
- Keep us informed of any household symptoms, COVID tests and results. If your child has a test please email a copy of the result to contact-us@skertonstlukes.lancs.sch.uk
- Spread out your arrival and pick up times using our window system fully. **Please note changes in times.** These are closer together in order to keep movement flowing and time spent on the playground to a minimum. We will no longer have signs telling you when to enter the school grounds so please take care and respect the 2m distance between people.
- You can enter the school grounds before school as the main gate will be open. Please **stay on the drive**, until you are asked to come onto the playground. Please stand 2 metres apart if you choose to do this.
- KS2 children are encouraged to be left at the front gate and make their own way in to join the class line. Our aim is everyone's safety – Keep Moving - DROP AND GO!

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- Siblings will leave together at the earliest time of collection, again to minimize time spent on the
 playground. It is important that children are dropped/ collected and you leave the school grounds
 immediately in order to ensure the least amount of contact as possible. Our aim is everyone's
 safety Keep Moving DROP AND GO!
- Children must have their own labelled water bottles.
- The only items children are permitted to bring from home are: book bags, packed lunch and water bottles.
- Due to the need to keep classrooms well ventilated, children must bring appropriate clothing and footwear to school. Unless it is PE day, children must not wear trainers but can wear black boots for warmth. Children can wear school hoodies in order to keep warm in school.
- If you are collecting your child from school for an appointment, you **must** let us know in advance. You will be required to **wear a face covering** if you enter the school building to collect your child.
- Please remember to park with care and consideration for others, including staying off the yellow lines. Please stick to the rules and routines in order to keep everyone safe.

Whilst school is able to open for all children the expectation is that your child/ children will attend school. If your child is unable to attend they are expected to access online learning via Class Dojo unless they are unwell.

In order to help with this, parents of school aged children can now have access to Lateral Flow Testing. For more information please follow this link Rapid Lateral Flow testing

Please note that bookings for Early Birds and Night Owls should be made in advance on Parent APP or by contacting the school office. Sessions will resume on our return to school.

Please continue to keep yourselves and each other safe.
