Home Activities – To go home every Friday, completed at home and returned on Wednesday.

Reading books – We will change your child's reading book when we are sure they can read/discuss it well. Listening to your child read every night is important and supports your child in their early reading development. As is reading to your child to model how to read. You do not need to read the whole book each night, a page or two will still provide your child with the practise they need to use and apply their phonics skills. The Rainbow Reading Challenge has started again! Please encourage your child to take part to achieve Gold at the end of this half term and "Congratulations" to those who achieved Gold Autumn 2.
