# Will the Buddy system continue?

Your child will be assigned a 'Buddy' from our Year 6 class as soon as classes are able to mix following Government guidance. Buddies are there to help, support and nurture your child as they start school.

#### What are WOW moments?

Wow moments are to celebrate your child's achievements and successes. We will place copies of Wow moments in your child's homework diary for

you to complete at home for your child to bring to school and share with the class. This could be anything from learning how to ride a bike, getting dressed independently for school, retelling a story in their own words, etc. Anything that you and your child are proud of to contribute to their Learning Journey and Record of Achievement.

#### What is a Learning Journey?

A Learning Journey is a file that we keep as a record of your child starting school through to the end of the Reception year. It tracks your child's knowledge, understanding and skills across all areas of learning and acts as evidence of your child working within the Early Years Curriculum to meet end of year expectations.

#### When will my child start to bring reading books home?

Your child will bring home a book from our school reading scheme the week commencing Monday 14<sup>th</sup> September to share with you at home. Further information to follow regarding reading, home learning and Phonics at Skerton St Luke's.
