### **Understanding the World**

We will learn about the season spring as it approaches. We will explore our surroundings looking for signs of spring and investigate and record the changes we see. We will become **Nature Detectives**. We will talk about the weather and how it changes through the seasons and passing of time. We will be planting seeds and bulbs in our garden centre and outdoor mini allotment observing the changes closely and begin to make links with the changes we see in plants to how we as humans and animals grow.

#### **Expressive Arts and Design**

We will be taking on the roles of gardener, shop assistant, customer, etc. We will learn to sing new songs and use musical instruments to explore making different sounds and finding/making the beat. We will explore colour, texture and shape to create products and art work for our garden centre.

- Place in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number.
- Add and subtract two single-digit numbers and count on or back to find the answer using objects..
- Use the language of 'more' and 'fewer' to compare two sets of objects.
- Finds the total number of items in two groups by counting all of them.
- Begin to use the vocabulary involved in adding and subtracting.
- Estimates how many objects they can see and checks by counting them.

#### "Plan Do Review"

Weekly guided reading sessions will continue to develop skills such as decoding words, sight recognition of HFW, learning new words and comprehension of what we have read, understanding the text.

Our "Seed Diary" will help us to observe and record the changes we see growing our own.

#### RE

Love and Easter is the focus as we explore and hegin to understand Christianity at this special time of year. The Easter Story focuses on Jesus' death and resurrection as an act of incredible love. We will explore the events of Holy week from Palm Sunday to Easter Day through stories, role-play and pictures.

Indoor and outdoor continuous provision will be used to support the children's learning and interests across all areas of the Early Years curriculum
